

## Spanish Major Requirements

### Introductory Courses (12 credits)

- Spanish 223: *Introduction to Hispanic Cultures*
- Spanish 224: *Introduction to Hispanic Literatures*
- Spanish 225: *Lying, Swearing, and Breaking the Rules: An Introduction to the Linguistic Study of Spanish*
- Spanish 311: *Advanced Language Practice*

### Survey Literature (3 credits)

- \_\_\_\_\_ one three-credit 300-level survey literature course  
(choose from Spanish 322\*, 324, 326)  
*\*Spanish 322 is recommended for students interested in historical linguistics.*

### Linguistics (3 credits)

- \_\_\_\_\_ one three-credit linguistics course at or above the 300-level  
(choose from Spanish 320, 321, 327, 331, 420, 429, 446, 474)

### Culture / Civilization (6 credits)

- \_\_\_\_\_ two three-credit culture or civilization courses at or above the 300-level  
(choose from Spanish 361, 363, 445, 468, 469, 472, 476, 477, 478, 480, 490)

**\*OR\***

- \_\_\_\_\_ one three-credit culture or civilization course at or above the 300-level  
(choose from Spanish 361, 363, 445, 468, 469, 472, 476, 477, 478, 480, 490)

**AND**

- \_\_\_\_\_ one three-credit targeted language skills course at or above the 300-level  
(choose from Spanish 317, 318, 319, 323, 325, 329, 359, 473)

### 400-Level Electives (12 credits)

- \_\_\_\_\_ four three-credit courses at or above the 400-level\*  
*\*Alternatively, students may opt to replace **one** 400-level Spanish course with LitTrans 245, 252, or Portuguese 301.*

**36 Total Credits** are required.

- At least **fifteen credits** of Spanish\* **at any level** must be obtained while physically present on the UW-Madison campus (Study Abroad Stipulation),
- six of which must be at or above the 400-level** (Faculty Engagement).
- At least **fifteen upper-level Spanish\* credits** (Spanish 311 and above) must be “in residence”, either while physically present on the UW-Madison campus or via UW-Madison or affiliate study abroad programs.

\*Please note that **only** Spanish courses count toward these residency requirements. LitTrans or Portuguese courses, for students opting to count them toward the Spanish major, will not also count toward residency.
